

# Visiting artist shares knowledge

Throughout the month of February, Doane University's Rall Gallery will be hosting visiting exhibition artist Lauren Woods. Woods has several paintings, drawings, digital prints and videos on display to the community and the public in the Rall Gallery until Feb. 28.

Woods received her Masters of Fine Arts in painting from the New York Academy of Art after completing her Bachelors in studio art at Spring Hill College. She is currently an assistant professor of art in the Department of Art and Art History at Auburn University, where she teaches both drawing and painting courses.

Her work is centered around the exploration of the concept of mythic time.

"Mythic time is broadly defined as a perpetual present outside of the linear perception of time, an abstract awareness where everything is eternally happening all at once," Woods' artist statement reads. "This holistic perception of time reclaims principles of intuition, unity and connection with natural cycles of transformation."

Woods' statement also addresses her perspective that mythic time can take almost any form.




